North Campus Food Pantry Donations

Dr. Meiklejohn is an Associate Professor of Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery at the University of New Mexico. He completed his M.D. from Geisel School of Medicine at Dartmouth University and residency training at Stanford Hospital and Clinics, and has been on the faculty of the University of New Mexico since, where he is the residency program director and the head of General Otolaryngology. He has numerous awards for teaching and education, including winning the UNM Award for Excellence in Medical Student Education for the last six consecutive years. He has served on the American Academy of Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery Socioeconomic and Grassroots Committee, is a past president of the New Mexico Society of Otolaryngology, and is a founding member of the new American Academy of Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery Environmental Sustainability Task Force. His research activities focus on environmental impacts and sustainability in medicine and surgery.



ABOUT THE COURSE

Concepts in Climate Change and Public Health Preparedness is an Undergraduate/Graduate variable credit elective course which integrates the conceptual foundations of public health preparedness and topics in climate change and health. This course examines the impacts of climate change on human health and ecological systems and provides an overview of climate change science as well as disaster prediction and preparation/mitigation science. Students will gain knowledge of the expected effects of climate change on regional, national and global populations and will explore strategies that health professionals and community planners can use with populations in their care. Students will focus on the adverse impacts of climate change on New Mexico and surrounding regions and will explore strategies to reduce the adverse impacts that climate change has and will have on our communities. Students will also have an opportunity to explore how they "fit in" to the work that lies ahead in this field and find ways to engage in communities of action/planning/policy and advocacy. Students will also engage in discussions and readings that envision a healthy and sustainable future for planetary and human health. This is an interdisciplinary course, so students will have the opportunity to study the work of community organizers, prevention and policy leaders, the emergency response system and health and environmental health work in education, adaptation, mitigation and resilience.



Get SMAHRT About Street Medicine

- The newly formed <u>Street Medicine</u>, <u>Addiction</u>, <u>and Harm Reduction Team</u> (<u>SMAHRT</u>) held its first general meeting on Tuesday, January 30, 2024.
- Co-chairs Morgan Stein and Jenna Norton, both first year med students, come from a strong foundation of work and service in the field. Previously, Norton was a social worker in street medicine and substance use, while Stein volunteers at the Healthcare for the Homeless clean needle exchange.
- Norton states, "We're trying to uphold the values and principles of those who've come before us and set a precedent for allied health students to learn about this incredible work.
- The huge interest in this group proves what we always knew: that students
 desire more training and exposure to the social problems and challenges in
 New Mexico communities."
- With the oversight of Lindsay Fox, PA-C and Sara Doorley, MD, the SMAHRT team intends to expand its work like similar programs throughout the country.
- Stein adds, "So many other medical and nursing schools embrace street medicine and harm reduction programs. We want to be part of that culture of innovation and transformative disruption."
